During this week Genoa promoted a lot of events and thematic initiatives in order to increase the citizens awareness on sustainable mobility around the city.


In this context thanks to Ele.C.Tra project, the Municipality organized also several activities for the promotion of the use of electric scooters.

LAUNCHING EVENT - 13 DECEMBER 2013

The Municipality of Genoa organized a great initiative: the Launching Event of the Ele.C.Tra project during which the importance of the "sustainable mobility" was highlighted.

Politicians, Public Authorities, decision makers and representatives of local and national SMEs, and some EU partners met in the Berio Library meeting room.

This event was held in conjunction with the Regione Liguria workshop on 3i plus a EU project on mobile information services for intermodal interregional transport financed by the Italy - France "Maritime" 2007-2013 programme

The plenary session was followed by an open session in which the attendees could express their opinions, questions, suggestions and actively participate to the debate.

Then, a collaborative and operative living lab session was dedicated to some questions as: "Chaotic cities, pollution, expensive fuels insurance, maintenance cost: why did market not developed?" or "Why is it that electric scooter market, alike from China, did not developed in Italy or Spain?"

Genoa Municipality aimed to promote the Ele.C.Tra idea letting participate the public and the users on the importance of sustainable mobility matters giving their active contribution with suggestions, ideas and opportunity for collaboration.
